






What is needed to address the current global health challenges?

Equality of Resources

Basic necessities/resources for health are not limited, but social inequality makes them limited. All stakeholders need to work together to change this. Mutual cooperation across countries is key.

Address Root Causes of Global Health Challenges

Multidisciplinary work is essential to address the root causes of global health challenges, such as poverty. Public health institutions should make more efforts to link with organizations addressing poverty.

Bridge Gap between Research and Implementation

Finding ways to bridge knowledge generation, theories and implementation needs to be addressed. Stakeholders need to work together to find ways to address implementation and scale-up challenges.

Advocate Access to Knowledge

Lack of education/knowledge and qualified personnel needs to be addressed. Access to knowledge via virtual platforms and empowering teachers to increase the quality and scope of education should be advocated. Governments should be made accountability to generate and further knowledge.

Truth and Trust

Moral issues of keeping people informed with 'truthful' info will be hard to regulate. Public organizations should actively take on this challenge, to help the public regain their trust in the scientific and public health communities.
